HAS THE BIBLE BEEN CHANGED?

In today's world, many people believe that the Bible has been changed. Some people also believe that what the original authors were trying to communicate has been lost because the text has been retranslated over and over again. How can we know that the text is reliable?

The Bible teaches that God has magnified His word above His name Psalm 138:2 and Jesus Himself stated that "Scripture cannot be broken" John 10:35. The Apostle Paul confirms in 2 Timothy 3:16 that Scripture is "God-breathed" and profitable for teaching, reproof, correction and training in righteousness.

If the Bible is correct, and Jesus and Paul's words hold true, then we should be able to demonstrate that the text is trustworthy, reliable, still relevant today, and most importantly: it hasn't been changed. Can we do this? Yes, we can!

DO WE TRANSLATE FROM EXISTING TRANSLATIONS?

The claim that the Bible has lost its original meaning through multiple retranslations is false. In the game of Chinese whispers, each whisper opens the possibility for an error or a mistake to be made. The more whispers there are, the greater the difference between the first and last whisper.

However, translations of the Bible are not done like a game of Chinese whispers. All translations use original manuscripts as their source material. They do **not** use prior translations, so even if an error or mistake is made in an old translation, this would not perpetuate through future translations.



ARE THE ORIGINAL MANUSCRIPTS ACCURATE?

Through a process called "textual criticism", we can compare the multitude of biblical manuscripts to check for errors. The number or weight of source material means this process is highly effective. Take the 3 lines below from *Psalm* 119:105 and it is clear where an error exists.

> Manuscript 1: "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path." Manuscript 2: "Your yord is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path." Manuscript 3: "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a might for my path."

It is clear in the above what the original text should say. The number of errors in the above is also must higher than the number of errors that exists in the manuscripts we have available today. We can be absolutely sure that our Bibles today accurately reflects the author's original message.

The "Dead Sea Scrolls" were discovered in 1947 and were more than 1000 years older than all other manuscripts at the time. They contained parts of every Old Testament book (except one). Variations in the text after a thousand years of manual copying are minimal and reinforce the validity of scripture. God has indeed magnified His word and it is as relevant today as it has always been.

4: Confess Your Faith: Publicly confess your faith in Jesus Christ as your Lord and Saviour. This confession can be made through a declaration of your faith in front of others, such as in a church setting or among fellow believers.

5: Follow Jesus: Commit to following Jesus and His teachings. Seek to deepen your relationship with Him through prayer, studying the Bible, and being part of a Christian community. **Allow the Holy Spirit to guide and transform your life, helping you to live in a way that is pleasing to God.**
